Pictures shall be emailed to bernard.perkins@lanecountyor.gov and invest@oregonhumane.org and may not be altered in any way.
- Defendant shall pay restitution for costs of care related to seized horses that were under her care at the time of seizure. As set forth in the restitution schedule filed with the court. If Defendant does not pay the full amount up-front, payments may be made monthly.
- Defendant shall attend a probation check-in with the supervising Judge every 4 months.
- Defendant stipulates that a probation violation finding related to above conditions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 shall allow the probation judge to forfeit her ownership in the animals at issue as part of the violation sanction.

Count 11 : Animal Neglect in the Second Degree

Count number 11, Animal Neglect in the Second Degree, 167.325, Misdemeanor Class B, committed on or about 10/29/2019. Conviction is based upon a Guilty Plea on 02/04/2020.

Probation

Defendant is sentenced to Bench Probation for a period of 5 year(s) and shall be subject to the following conditions of Probation:

Defendant is subject to the following general conditions of probation (ORS 137.540):

- Violate no law and shall report to the Court in writing every citation or arrest on any new crime or major traffic offense within five days after citation or arrest. Mail correspondence to: Lane County Circuit Court, 125 East 8th Avenue, Eugene, Oregon, 97401, and include the case number.
- Notify the Court, District Attorney, and defendant's attorney, in writing, within 5 days of any change in residence, employment, or name. Mail correspondence to: Lane County Circuit Court, 125 East 8th Avenue, Eugene, Oregon, 97401, and include the case number.
- Pay the Money Award in full. If a Payment Agreement is ordered, defendant must make payments according to that schedule. The entire judgment must be paid in full 60 days prior to the expiration of probation. Payments should be mailed to: Lane County Circuit Court, 125 East 8th Avenue, Eugene, Oregon, 97401, and all correspondence should include the case number.
- If physically able, find and maintain gainful full-time employment, approved schooling, or a full-time combination of both.

Furthermore, Defendant is subject to the following Special Conditions of Probation (ORS 137.540(2)): Defendant shall:

- Defendant shall only personally possess 4 horses (hereinafter: The 4 Horses). The horses are as follows: Rex AA 628853, Kyra BV, Babe (possibly in foal) 605235. If, after 18 months, defendant is in compliance with all probation conditions, she may approach the Court for permission to add up to four (4), specific horses. The State will not object so long as there have been no sustained probation violations, restitution payments are current, and there are no probation violations alleged and pending resolution. All added horses shall be subject to the same restrictions as The 4 Horses.
- Defendant shall provide the State ownership/registration paperwork for each of The 4 Horses at the time of sentencing. The 4 Horses are the only 4 horses Defendant shall physically possess during probation. The 4 Horses must always stay on Defendant s current property (33005 Camas Swale Road, Creswell, Oregon, hereinafter The Property), except in the circumstances described in #3, below.
- No breeding of Defendant s stallion without the involvement of a licensed Doctor of Veterinary Medicine. Breeding must take place off The Property. No additional horses may be brought onto the property to breed or to be bred. Defendant s mares shall not be bred. In a true emergency threatening life or health of the animals, horses may be removed from The Property and brought directly to a licensed veterinary facility. Defendant shall notify Lane County Animal Services before or as soon as practicable after moving a horse off The Property due to an emergency.
- Defendant shall not purchase horses except when acting as a purchasing agent for a third party. Horses purchased in this manner may not come under the physical care/control of Defendant or onto The Property at any time.

- If a horse is brought to The Property for hoof care by Michael DeLeonardo, they shall not be possessed by or cared for by Defendant, and they must be housed in a quarantine stall separate from The 4 Horses. No more than one horse at a time may be brought to The Property for hoof care. Advance notice of horses coming to The Property for hoof care shall be sent to bernard.perkins@lanecountyor.gov and invest@oregonhumane.org. This notice shall include a description of the horse at issue and the name of and contact information for the horses owner/agent.
- Once Defendant is properly licensed and insured, she may approach the court for permission to haul horses. If Defendant is in compliance with probation at that time, the State will not object to Defendant hauling horses. Under no circumstances shall Defendant haul horses (apart from The 4 Horses) onto The Property.
- Defendant shall obey all DEQ/Dept of Ag/Lane County General Services orders. Defendant shall comply with all licensing requirements for animals residing at The Property.
- Defendant shall permit unannounced visits at The Property from Lane County Animal Services (LCAS), Lane County Sheriff's Office (LCSO), or Oregon Humane Society (OHS) agents during normal business hours Mon-Sat. Defendant shall allow the agents to take pictures of The 4 Horses, any other animals on The Property, and all horse-related housing and feed on demand. Defendant shall answer any questions the agents have about animal care truthfully. If, upon their examination of The 6 Horses or any other animals, any concerns are raised by the agents, Defendant shall address those concerns within the timeframe given by the agent.
- Defendant shall provide monthly digital pictures of each of The 4 horses sufficient to see overall body condition and hay and grain receipts to LCAS Officer Bernard Perkins. Pictures shall be emailed to bernard.perkins@lanecountyor.gov and invest@oregonhumane.org and may not be altered in any way.
- Defendant shall pay restitution for costs of care related to seized horses that were under her care at the time of seizure. As set forth in the restitution schedule filed with the court. If Defendant does not pay the full amount up-front, payments may be made monthly.
- Defendant shall attend a probation check-in with the supervising Judge every 4 months.
- Defendant stipulates that a probation violation finding related to above conditions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 shall allow the probation judge to forfeit her ownership in the animals at issue as part of the violation sanction.
