It is adjudged that the defendant has been convicted on the following count(s):

Count 1 : Sexual Assault of an Animal

Count number 1, Sexual Assault of an Animal, 167.333, Felony Class C, committed on or between 01/29/2021 and 01/28/2024. Conviction is based upon a Guilty Plea on 03/27/2024.

Sentencing Guidelines

The Crime Severity Classification (CSC) on Count Number 1 is 6 and the Criminal History Classification (CHC) is I.

Probation

Defendant is sentenced to Supervised Probation for a period of 36 month(s) and shall be subject to the following conditions of Probation:

Defendant is subject to the following general conditions of probation (ORS 137.540):

- Pay fines, restitution or other fees ordered by the court.
- Submit to testing for controlled substance, cannabis or alcohol use if the probationer has a history of substance abuse or if there is a reasonable suspicion that the probationer has illegally used controlled substances.
- Participate in a substance abuse evaluation as directed by the supervising officer and follow the recommendations of the evaluator if there are reasonable grounds to believe there is a history of substance abuse.
- Remain in the State of Oregon until written permission to leave is granted by the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency.
- Not change residence without prior permission from the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency and inform the parole and probation officer of any change in employment.
- Permit the parole and probation officer to visit the probationer or the probationer's work site or residence and to conduct a walk-through of the common areas and of the rooms in the residence occupied by or under the control of the probationer.
- Consent to the search of person, vehicle or premises upon the request of a representative of the supervising officer if the supervising officer has reasonable grounds to believe that evidence of a violation will be found, and submit to fingerprinting or photographing, or both, when requested by the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency for supervision purposes.
- Obey all laws, municipal, county, state and federal, and in circumstances in which state and federal law conflict, obey state law.
- Promptly and truthfully answer all reasonable inquiries by the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency.
- Not possess weapons, firearms or dangerous animals.
- Report as required and abide by the direction of the supervising officer.
- If recommended by the supervising officer, successfully complete a sex offender treatment program approved by the supervising officer and submit to polygraph examinations at the direction of the supervising officer if the probationer: (A) Is under supervision for a sex crime as defined in ORS 163A.005 or harassment under ORS 166.065(4)(a)(A); (B) Was previously convicted of a sex crime as defined in ORS 163A.005; or (C) Was previously convicted in another jurisdiction of an offense that would constitute a sex crime as defined in ORS 163A.005 if committed in this state.
- Participate in a mental health evaluation as directed by the supervising officer and follow the recommendation of the evaluator.
- If required to report as a sex offender under ORS 163A.015, report with the Department of State Police, a city police department, a county sheriff's office or the supervising agency: (A) When supervision begins; (B) Within 10 days of a change in residence; (C) Once each year within 10 days of the probationer's date of birth; (D) Within 10 days of the first day the person works at, carries on a vocation at or attends an institution of higher education; and (E) Within 10 days of a change in work, vocation or attendance status at an institution of higher education.
- Submit to a risk and needs assessment as directed by the supervising officer and follow reasonable recommendations resulting from the assessment.

Furthermore, Defendant is subject to the following Special Conditions of Probation (ORS 137.540(2)): Defendant shall:

- No contact with animals prior without written permission of the Probation Officer.
- Enter into, pay for, and successfully complete a sex abuse evaluation and treatment as directed by the probation officer.

Jail as a Condition of Probation

Defendant is confined to jail for 30 day(s). Defendant is to report to by 03/29/2024. Defendant may receive credit for time served.

The Defendant may be considered by the supervisory authority for any form of alternative sanction authorized by ORS 423.478, and the defendant shall pay any required per diem fees.
